SUBJECT: "THE AULT PARK SITE" (illustrated).

This past summer Dr. Emerson directed the joint University of Toronto - National Museum of Canada excavation of this "Point Peninsula" site, located on Sheek Island in the St. Lawrence River. By December of this year the waters of the Long Sault Rapids, which rock and roll their tumbled white caps about 200' below Sheek Island, will be cut off completely, as part of the St. Lawrence Seaway project; those of us who were fortunate enough to work on the "Ault Park Site" will not readily forget the beauty and personality of these rapids which have sounded their way through 3500 years (or more) of human history - but which, alas, will shortly not even be as tangible as that very history!
